Frank Dobbin received his Ph.D. from Stanford University in 1987 and his B.A. from Oberlin College in 1980. Dobbin studies organizations, inequality, economic behavior, and public policy. His *Inventing Equal Opportunity* (Princeton 2009) shows how corporate personnel managers defined what it meant to discriminate. His *Forging Industrial Policy: United States, Britain, and France in the Railway Age* (Cambridge 1994), traces nations' modern industrial strategies to early differences in their political systems. *The New Economic Sociology: A Reader* (Princeton 2004) assembles classics in economic sociology. *The Sociology of the Economy* (Russell Sage 2004) compiles research in economic sociology from leading scholars. *The Global Diffusion of Markets and Democracy* (Cambridge 2008) explores the rise of neoliberal policies in the post-war period.
